The minutes suggested that a decision was made and the county was moving forward with construction. If in fact it was to consider the project, we should make that clear in the minutes, he further stated.

# REPORTS:

1) COUNTY ENGINEER: Mr. Church updated the Board on the following public works projects:

The Gateway Project in Wildwood had resumed work. Currently there were new traffic patterns. There would be a semi-permanent pattern established by Thursday. The two lanes on the east side of the bridge were going to be shifted to the extreme north of center line. So, there was going to be only one lane in and one lane out during the course of construction. The traffic signal at Susquehanna & Rio Grande Avenue was going to be taken off line. You won't be able to travel in a northerly direction on Susquehanna, but would be able to go south. Basically there will be just two lanes of traffic in and out of the

corridor from Park Avenue to the bridge. That's to allow for the construction of the southerly Moment Slab wall and other drainage improvements that were going to be constructed throughout the next two months. Right now they're doing utility relocations for the remaining utilities and were in the process of dealing with some drainage conflicts with the 24 inch water main. Things appear to be fine, but there is still one more test pit to be done. The contractor was aggressively working now. They held a meeting with the police to deal with some traffic control issues and concerns they had. That seems to have all been resolved.

Main Street in Dennis Township was base paved today. That was the section that runs from Rt. 47 to Dennisville-Petersburg Road. Tomorrow the intermediate course would be installed. On Thursday, they would top it with the surface course. On Friday, Mr. Church would meet with them to go over the layout of the speed tables. There had been two speed tables proposed along that road to form a barrier to slow traffic down. That will be done in the next week.

Hope Corson Road should begin in approximately 10 days. The contractor was delayed because of some pre-cast concrete inlets and manholes that were needed for the project.

The County received a \$1.6 million dollar federal aid grant for Corson Tavern Road. Public works would be advertising for bids within the next 45 days for that project. The agreement had been forwarded to the board for signature. Once he had it back it would be sent back to the State so the agreement could be executed and money made available.

Bids were accepted for the Ingram's Thorofare Project, last Thursday. It was expected the project would be underway by the end of October, beginning of November.

On October 10<sup>th</sup> bids were going to be accepted for the Woodbine Roundabout Project.

- 2) COUNTY COUNSEL: Jeffrey Lindsay had no report.
- 3) COUNTY TREASURER: Brittany Smith informed the scheduled bond sale took place on September 12<sup>th</sup>. There were seven bidders, making twenty-nine bids. An interest rate of 2.21% over 15 years was secured for the County.

# FREEHOLDER REPORTS:

1) FREEHOLDER MOREY: Freeholder Morey reported on the UAS Conference; today being the final day of three dedicated to the 5th annual event. thanked Freeholders Pierson and Hayes for showing their support by joining the other attendees on the second day of the conference in Wildwood. The theme this year was Urban Air Mobility. Three representatives from the FAA Tech Center contributed in staging this years' event, which started off Sunday evening at the Cape May Winery. The second day of the conference was held at the Wildwood Convention Center. A presentation and tour of the FAA Tech Center at the Atlantic City International Airport rounded out the itinerary. Former U.S. Rep. Frank LoBiondo participated in the conference, taking part in a fireside chat today. In addition to the FAA Tech Center, the freeholder acknowledged the Cape May County Chamber of Commerce, Vicki Clark and Brigitta Faragasso, who partnered in producing the conference. Carole Mattessich did an excellent job in pulling together the talent and speakers. Additionally, he thanked Nancy Mauro and her department for supporting the effort as well.

2) FREEHOLDER PIERSON: Freeholder Pierson informed his colleagues of his participation and/or experience at the following events: Cape May County and City of Ocean City Patriot Day Ceremonies; Veterans' Day Ceremony preparation meeting; Lower Township Chamber of Commerce monthly meeting; tour under the Wildwood Boardwalk with Senator Steve Sweeney; Volunteers in Medicine 13th Annual Celebration; Southern New Jersey Freeholders Association meeting in Millville; Healthy Community Coalition breakfast at Avalon Links Restaurant.

On behalf of the Board, Freeholder Pierson congratulated and acknowledged Kathy Pittaluga of the Municipal Alliance Program for her exemplary service and commitment to the program. She was recognized as "Volunteer of the Year" by the County and New Jersey State Municipal Alliance for 2019.

3) FREEHOLDER HAYES: Freeholder Hayes informed her colleagues of her participation and/or experience at the following events: Cape May County and City of Ocean City Patriot Day Ceremonies; New Jersey Association of Counties meeting; tour under the Wildwood Boardwalk with Senator Steve Sweeney; Healthy Community Coalition breakfast acknowledging Recovery Court; Ocean City Historical Museum benefit featuring Bill Hughes as keynote speaker.

She reported on a story which came to her recently through the county library director. Wildwood Crest Library would soon have a restored Civil War flag on display compliments of Joe Orlando, Commander of the North Wildwood VFW. Mr. Orlando placed a box at the branch so people could drop off their old flags for proper retirement she explained. He then collected the flags from the library location periodically, for that purpose. A flag from the Civil War era had been left. Mr. Orlando offered to have it restored for the library. A dedication ceremony was being planned for around Veteran's Day.

4) FREEHOLDER DESIDERIO: Mr. Desiderio thanked and congratulated Kathy Pittaluga on her award and noted that the Pittaluga and LaRosa families have been great citizens of Cape May County, most particularly Sea Isle City, for many years. He thanked them for all they have done both past and future.

Director Thornton and Freeholder Desiderio attended and spoke during the American Legion MIA POW ceremony in Sea Isle City. The American Legion did an excellent job. The program which highlighted the many still missing soldiers, after all this time, was very touching and moving he related.

The freeholder extended a thank you to Engineer Bob Church and Freeholder Morey in recognition of the completion of Sea Isle Boulevard and also the fishing pier in Dennis Township.

5) FREEHOLDER THORNTON: Director Thornton participated in all that was previously mentioned so had nothing new to report. He added that on Patriot's Day an FBI Agent from Upper Township was honored. Because of his participation on 9-11, the man had become ill later and was considered a casualty.

PUBLIC COMMENTS: On behalf of himself and several neighbors, Michael Zuckerman of Bennys Landing Road, Cape May Court House spoke in opposition to further development on the Laguna Oaks Golf Course and homes sites project. Mr. Zuckerman requested the help of the BOCF in preserving a National Heritage Priority Site situated in their neighborhood. He named Fred Langford, developer and partner, Will Morey as responsible for the continued development.

Jim Quirk, Cape May Court House, identified himself and the Wetland Preservation Alliance as an organized group opposing high density development and systematic clearing of said area. He explained the groups objective was to preserve what was left of NJDEP designated Natural Heritage Priority Site from further destruction, and to set the record straight. A lengthy presentation ensued. Mr. Quirk directed interested parties to go to wetlandpreservationalliance.com to view the data.

Lisa Andreula of East Pacific Avenue, CMCH spoke in opposition of new development in the wetlands, specifically on the site of Laguna Oaks Townhomes. Ms. Andreula called upon the BOCF to pass a resolution urging both the DEP and Middle Township officials to take whatever steps necessary to prevent any additional clearing and destruction of this Natural Heritage Priority Site.

Vicki Sutton, 333 East Pacific Avenue, CMCH commented she was seeking assistance from the BOCF for finding a solution concerning further development; someone to look into the issue. When Ms. Sutton purchased her property a year ago she was told by Middle Township that no building could be done in the area behind her house because it was marsh and wetlands.

Georgina Shanley of Ocean City thanked what she termed as "citizen watchdogs", who were trying to protect the environment and ecosystems. Ms. Shanley called for accountability and investigation into the matter by the BOCF.

Freeholder Morey responded with some history of the property and his connection to the project. He deferred to the professional consultants involved with the planned development, environmental consultant Pete Lomax, land use attorney Steve Nehmad, environmental attorney Michael Gross, the Township of Middle and NJDEP. Proper and appropriate approvals for the property were being sought through those channels.

Mr. Quirk gave copies of DEP violations to the Board.

Chris Talone of Bennys Landing Road spoke in opposition of further development in the area on behalf of the birds and turtles.

Maggie Magill of Bennys Landing Road spoke against further development, the community didn't want it she stated.

Director Thornton advised Middle Township had jurisdiction and the NJ DEP. He wondered what their response to this had been, so far.

Lisa Andreula answered people were being told different things and the lots had been re-done, re-zoned more than once. Originally there was only supposed to be 16 residential homes, but they built 45 homes. Now, another set had been put forth for approval. She stressed, the area had already been zoned a rural conservation area and was meant to be conserved, that's why they were upset.

As Mr. Quirk's presentation continued, Freeholder Morey broke in to indicate he didn't want his silence to be construed as agreement with what was being said.

Mr. Zuckerman asked the BOCF to weigh in with a position.

Marianna Lulas, Holmes Landing Road, Cape May Court House spoke against the possibility of Middle Township re-zoning for a proposed 4-storey Hampton Inn with 120 parking spaces on the former lot of Design Collaborative and calling it "Town Center".

Director Thornton informed that the state had come down recently and asked towns to revise some of their "Town Centers" in order to comply with change of state master plan which was created some 8 to 10 years ago.

The request was made to the BOCF for some type of position to be taken. Director Thornton pondered if they shouldn't refer the information to NJDEP and ask what they were doing, if there was any merit to this.

Freeholder Morey requested the BOCF not make a hasty decision, not knowing all the facts.

County Counsel, Jeff Lindsay advised there were avenues for the group to take. They could seek relief with the courts if they felt Middle Township was doing something wrong. They could file an Application in Lieu of Prerogative Writ with the Superior Court and have the actions examined. The issue was outside the jurisdiction of this board he further advised.

Someone, (name not stated) asked if Mr. Morey was benefitting financially from his involvement with the project.

Freeholder Morey informed that the project subject this approval was not marshland at all. Also, Mr. Langford was looking to restrict development from the entire golf course site. The site could potentially house up to 150-200 properties if it wasn't golf course or wasn't preserved.

Lisa Quirk, Cape May Court House stated her concern with Pete Lomax's applications, reports and land re-numbering.

Jeff Lindsay recommended the BOCF to take the information under consideration for an action in the future.

Director Thornton felt the DEP should be the agency to come down and make a recommendation. He had concern that proper procedures may have not been followed by DEP. More discussion followed. Mr. Lindsay recommended for a second time the Board read the information, review it and come back at a later date to make a recommendation or resolution if so inclined.
