2010-2012 American Community Survey 3-Year Estimates

Although the American Community Survey (ACS) produces population, demographic and housing unit estimates, it is the Census Bureau's Population Estimates Program that produces and disseminates the official estimates of the population for the nation, states, counties, cities and towns and estimates of housing units for states and counties.


Households and Families

In 2010-2012 there were 41,000 households in Cape May County, New Jersey. The average household size was 2.3 people.

Families made up 65 percent of the households in Cape May County, New Jersey. This figure includes both married-couple families (51 percent) and other families (14 percent). Of other families, 5 percent are female householder families with no husband present and own children under 18 years. Nonfamily households made up 35 percent of all households in Cape May County, New Jersey. Most of the nonfamily households were people living alone, but some were composed of people living in households in which no one was related to the householder.

In Cape May County, New Jersey, 25 percent of all households have one or more people under the age of 18; 37 percent of all households have one or more people 65 years and over.

In Cape May County, New Jersey, 2,100 grandparents lived with their grandchildren under 18 years old. Of those grandparents, 39 percent of them had financial responsibility for their grandchildren.

Nativity and Foreign Born


Ninety-five percent of the people living in Cape May County, New Jersey in 2010-2012 were native residents of the United States. Forty-seven percent of these residents were living in the state in which they were born.

Six percent of the people living in Cape May County, New Jersey in 2010-2012 were foreign born. Of the foreign born population, 42 percent were naturalized U.S. citizens, and 89 percent entered the country before the year 2010. Eleven percent of the foreign born entered the country in 2010 or later.

Foreign born residents of Cape May County, New Jersey come from different parts of the world.

Language


Among people at least five years old living in Cape May County, New Jersey in 2010-2012, 10 percent spoke a language other than English at home. Of those speaking a language other than English at home, 52 percent spoke Spanish and 48 percent spoke some other language; 45 percent reported that they did not speak English "very well."

In 2010-2012, 90 percent of the people at least one year old living in Cape May County, New Jersey were living in the same residence one year earlier.

Cape May County, New Jersey in 2010-2012




Education

In 2010-2012, 35 percent of people 25 years and over had a high school diploma or equivalency and 29 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Eleven percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in Cape May County, New Jersey was 19,000 in 2010-2012. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 2,000 and elementary or high school enrollment was 12,000 children. College or graduate school enrollment was 4,300.

Disability

In Cape May County, New Jersey, among the civilian noninstitutionalized population in 2010-2012, 14 percent reported a disability. The likelihood of having a disability varied by age - from 4 percent of people under 18 years old, to 11 percent of people 18 to 64 years old, and to 30 percent of those 65 and over.

Employment Status and Type of Employer


In Cape May County, New Jersey, 53 percent of the population 16 and over were employed; 40 percent were not currently in the labor force.

Seventy-three percent of the people employed were private wage and salary workers; 21 percent were federal, state, or local government workers; and 6 percent were self-employed in their own (not incorporated) business.



Commuting to Work

Seventy-seven percent of Cape May County, New Jersey workers drove to work alone in 2010-2012, and 9 percent carpooled. Among those who commuted to work, it took them on average 22 minutes to get to work.


Percent of Workers 16 and over Commuting by Mode in Cape May County, New Jersey in 2010-2012



Income


The median income of households in Cape May County, New Jersey was \$55,867. Ten percent of households had income below \$15,000 a year and 11 percent had income over \$150,000 or more.

Seventy-one percent of the households received earnings and 26 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. Forty-one percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$19,161. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.


Proportion of Households with Various Income Sources in Cape May County, New Jersey in 2010-2012



Poverty and Participation in Government Programs

In 2010-2012, 11 percent of people were in poverty. Sixteen percent of related children under 18 were below the poverty level, compared with 7 percent of people 65 years old and over. Seven percent of all families and 23 percent of families with a female householder and no husband present had incomes below the poverty level.

Poverty Rates in Cape May County, New Jersey in 2010-2012




Health Insurance

Among the civilian noninstitutionalized population in Cape May County, New Jersey in 2010-2012, 90 percent had health insurance coverage and 11 percent did not have health insurance coverage. For those under 18 years of age, 6 percent had no health insurance coverage. The civilian noninstitutionalized population had both private and public health insurance, with 72 percent having private coverage and 36 percent having public coverage.

Population

In 2010-2012, Cape May County, New Jersey had a total population of 97,000 - 50,000 (52 percent) females and 47,000 (49 percent) males. The median age was 47.9 years. Nineteen percent of the population was under 18 years and 22 percent was 65 years and older.

The Age Distribution of People in Cape May County, New Jersey in 2010-2012




For people reporting one race alone, 93 percent were White; 5 percent were Black or African American; 1 percent were American Indian and Alaska Native; 1 percent were Asian; less than 0.5 percent were Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and 1 percent were Some other race. Two percent reported Two or more races. Six percent of the people in Cape May County, New Jersey were Hispanic. Eighty-seven percent of the people in Cape May County, New Jersey were White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

Housing Characteristics

In 2010-2012, Cape May County, New Jersey had a total of 99,000 housing units, 58 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 66 percent were in single-unit structures, 31 percent were in multi-unit structures, and 4 percent were mobile homes. Twenty-six percent of the housing units were built since 1990.

The Types of Housing Units in Cape May County, New Jersey in 2010-2012




The median number of rooms in all housing units in Cape May County, New Jersey is 6. Of these housing units, 67 percent have three or more bedrooms.

Occupied Housing Unit Characteristics

In 2010-2012, Cape May County, New Jersey had 41,000 occupied housing units - 31,000 (75 percent) owner occupied and 11,000 (25 percent) renter occupied. Fifty-six percent of householders of these units had moved in since 2000. Sixty-three percent of the owner occupied units had a mortgage. Four percent of the households did not have telephone service. Ten percent had no vehicles available and another 15 percent had three or more.

House heating fuel used in Cape May County, New Jersey in 2010-2012



Housing Costs

The median monthly housing costs for mortgaged owners was \$1,959, nonmortgaged owners \$719, and renters \$1,029. Forty-seven percent of owners with mortgages, 25 percent of owners without mortgages, and 61 percent of renters in Cape May County, New Jersey spent 30 percent or more of household income on housing.

Data are based on a sample and are subject to sampling variability. The degree of uncertainty for an estimate arising from sampling variability is represented through the use of a margin of error. The value shown here is the 90 percent margin of error. The margin of error can be interpreted roughly as providing a 90 percent probability that the interval defined by the estimate minus the margin of error and the estimate plus the margin of error (the lower and upper confidence bounds) contains the true value. In addition to sampling variability, the ACS estimates are subject to nonsampling error (for a discussion of nonsampling variability, see Accuracy of the Data). The effect of nonsampling error is not represented in these tables.

Fertility data are not available for certain geographic areas due to problems with data collection. See Errata Note #92 for details.

The Census Bureau introduced a new set of disability questions in the 2008 ACS questionnaire. Accordingly, comparisons of disability data from 2008 or later with data from prior years are not recommended. For more information on these questions and their evaluation in the 2006 ACS Content Test, see the Evaluation Report Covering Disability.

While the 2010-2012 American Community Survey (ACS) data generally reflect the December 2009 Office of Management and Budget (OMB) definitions of metropolitan and micropolitan statistical areas; in certain instances the names, codes, and boundaries of the

principal cities shown in ACS tables may differ from the OMB definitions due to differences in the effective dates of the geographic entities.

Estimates of urban and rural population, housing units, and characteristics reflect boundaries of urban areas defined based on Census 2000 data. Boundaries for urban areas have not been updated since Census 2000. As a result, data for urban and rural areas from the ACS do not necessarily reflect the results of ongoing urbanization.
