

- Cooperative project of the State of New Jersey and the U.S. Bureau of the Census serving data users in the public, private, and academic sectors since 1980.
- Each state has an SDC acting as secondary distributors of Census data providing value added products and expertise for their respective state
- The NJSDC maintains a data dissemination network of over 110 state, county, regional, and local agencies.
 - Includes:
 - All 21 county planning boards
 - Metropolitan Planning Organizations – DVRPC, NJTPA
 - Representatives from 19 State Departments/Agencies
 - Federal Depository Libraries including the New Jersey State Library, Rutgers and Princeton University Libraries






Population Change

Population change is the rate of change in population between decennial census years. While every census region grew considerably during the twentieth century, the South and West experienced the largest increases in population.


POPULATION CHANGE SINCE 1910

REGIONAL POPULATION GROWTH 2000-2010











APPORTIONMENT IN 2010 NEW JERSEY










When included in the ranking, the District of Columbia ranks first in density (9,856.5 people per square mile), however among the 50 states NJ ranks first in density.







Proportion of Minority Population by County 2000 and 2010












