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What Does Your Health Department Do?

Your local public health department protects and improves the health and well-being of your community, as well as the environmental resources upon which we all depend.

Since 1900, the average lifespan of U.S. residents has increased by more than 30 years, with 25 years of this gain attributable to advances in public health, such as:

- Vaccination
- Motor-vehicle safety
- Safer workplaces
- Control of infectious diseases
- Decline in deaths from coronary heart disease and stroke
- Safer and healthier foods
- Healthier mothers and babies
- Family planning
- Fluoridation of drinking water
- Recognition of tobacco use as a health hazard

Today, your local, county, regional, and state public health agencies continue to promote health and wellness across New Jersey.

Cape May County Department of Health

- Protects you from health threats. Cape May County Department of Health works to prevent disease outbreaks and makes sure the water you drink, the food you eat, and the air you breathe are all safe. We are also ready to respond to any health emergency — be it bioterrorism, SARS, West Nile Virus, or a new environmental hazard.
- Educates you and your neighbors about health issues. Cape May County Department of Health provides you with information that helps you make healthy decisions, like exercising more, eating right, quitting smoking, and washing your hands to protect yourself from communicable diseases. During a public health emergency, we also provide important alerts and warnings to protect your health.
- Provides healthy solutions. Cape May County Department of Health offers the preventive care you need to avoid disease and maintain your health. We provide flu shots for the community, Cape May County hosts about 25 flu clinics annually. We also help provide children with regular check-ups, immunizations, and good nutrition to help them grow and learn.
- Advances community health. Cape May County Department of Health takes part in developing new policies and standards that address existing and emerging challenges to your community's health while enforcing a range of laws to help keep you safe. We work through research and staff training to maintain expertise and deliver up-to-date, cutting-edge health programs.

Cape May County Health Department & You – Improving Health Together!

Cape May County Department of Health continues to promote health and wellness throughout Cape May County. Through the distribution of vaccines, education, health screening, inspections, disease investigation, disease prevention, and emergency preparedness, Cape May County can promote health and wellness within the community.

In 2018 Cape May County Department of Health has increased services to better benefit residents of Cape May County. Cape May County Department of Health holds an annual New Jersey Cancer Education and Early Detection Breast Cancer Awareness Walk and Cape May County Resource Day to promote resources available to Cape May County Residents. The health department also participates in numerous health fairs and flu clinics throughout the county.

The county also uses multiple evidence based programs to educate its community. In 2018 programs offered were Take Control of Your Health, mold classes, Project healthy Bones, and Matter of Balance. NJCEED also provided annual breast, cervical, colorectal, and prostate screenings to the underinsured and uninsured. In 2018, Cape May County Department of Health had their Chose Your Cover event, skin cancer screenings with local dermatologists. Cape May County Department of Health Coordinates the Cape May County Medical Reserve Corps, a network of volunteers actively preparing and planning for health emergencies, as well as community outreach events. Cape May County Department of Health will continue to work towards a healthier community in 2018 by increasing education, evidence based programs, and maintaining the current education plan.

Administration

The Cape May County Department of Health operates under the *Public Health Practice Standards of Performance for Local Board of Health in New Jersey* (NJAC8:52) and serves each local municipality within Cape May County through Memorandums of Agreement. The Department of Health has a budget of approximately \$3.5 million with 36 full-time and 6-part time employees. It has five core functions upon which service activities are based: preventing epidemics and spread of disease, protecting the public against environmental hazards, promoting and encouraging healthy behaviors, assuring the quality and accessibility of health services, and responding to disasters as assisting communities to recover. The department is structured into six main divisions: 1) Administrative Services; 2) Environmental Services; 3) Public Health Nursing Services; 4) Laboratory Services; 5) Community Health Planning; and 6) Physical Therapy.

Public Health Goals

- Prevent epidemics and the spread of disease
- Protect against environmental hazards
- Prevent injuries
- Promote and encourage healthy behaviors
- Respond to disasters and assist communities in recovery
- Assure the quality and accessibility of health services.

Essential Public Health

- Monitor health status to identify community health problems and community resources
- Diagnose and investigate health problems and health hazards in the community
- Inform, educate, empower people about health issues
- Mobilize community partnership to identify and solve health problems
- Develop policies and plans to support individual and community health efforts
- Enforce laws and regulations that protect health and ensure safety
- Link people to needed personal health services and assure provision of health care when otherwise unavailable.
- Assure a competent public health and personal healthcare workforce
- Evaluate effectiveness, accessibility, and quality of personal and population-based health services.
- Research for new insights and innovative solutions to health problems.
